As the Data4Food2030 Monitor evolves, it will be progressively updated with data from additional case studies and validated by stakeholders involved in a growing number of DSIs. These stakeholders enrich our knowledge base with empirical evidence and contribute to the evaluation process by assessing the state of play and validating expected impacts from their specific contexts.
